

*Resolution 1*

*Disarmament as a possible solution for the Arab-Israeli conflict*

The United Nations Disarmament Commission,

*united in grief* by the high number of victims of all the involved countries,

*deeply concerned* about the persistent violence in the Middle-East,

*aiming* to improve the situation of the people affected by this conflict,

*keen* to find a fair solution that satisfies both parts of the conflict,

*noting* unlawful acts committed by the conflict parties,

*acknowledging* the United Nations Disarmament Commission might finally be able to avoid further deaths caused by the Arab-Israeli conflict,

*acknowledging* the problem of unfair water distribution in the region

1. *encourages* the member states of the United Nations to help stop the attacks from both sides;
2. *pressingly* recommends that the State of Israel should disarm all kinds of weapons of mass destruction;
3. *emphasizes* to protect certain ethnic groups or citizens, especially the liberty of these groups.

4. *suggests* that the Security Council makes a decision about the separation of Palestine and Israel.

5. *demand*s a peace agreement which includes a fair solution for every nation involved.

6. *support*s efforts to decrease civilian casualties on all sides.

7. *seek*s the communication with the leadings of the officially not recognized armed groups in a peaceful way.

8. *suggest*s the officially not recognized armed groups such as Hamas and Fatah to clarify their demands.

9. *emphasize*s that Israel benefits from the objective of the resolution because the result will be peace and liberty for all citizens
